First of all I was plunged into financial hardship in my late twenties after a prosperous start as a young adult. Then later, on better financial footing, I entered a profession where I was confronted constantly by the needy asking for help.

In Lk. Jesus visits the house of a Pharisee named Simon. A woman of questionable character crashed the dinner party. After rebuking his host for lack of hospitality to him, Jesus asks his host, "Simon, do you see the woman?" If you have not done so already, I ask you to see the students and teachers who labor with limited resources. My parents never had to choose between buying school supplies and buying groceries. Those households do exist in our community. For all of you who support this ministry, my God bless you as you bless others.

# The United Thank Offering (UTO) and The Church Periodical Club (CPC)

Again, this year the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) are collecting for the United Thank Offering (UTO) and the CPC (Church Periodical Club) on separate dates. The management of these two offerings are supported through the National Office and all money collected is sent directly to the diocese. If you use the coin collection boxes, please convert coins to paper money before making your offering.

UTO ingathering is scheduled for October 6th (the first Sunday in October). Collection boxes and envelopes will be on the table in the Narthex. The UTO collection supports grants for missions and ministry in the diocese. Individual churches or missions can apply to the diocese for grants from these funds.

CPC supports the provision of printed materials such as bibles and hymnals to churches and ministries in need of these materials. CPC ingathering will be the first Sunday in May (May 4th). Envelopes for this offering will be on the table in the Narthex at the appropriate time.

### **FOOD 4 KIDS / AKA: BACKPACKS 4 KIDS**

#### History:

Created in 2004, when children were observed stuffing their pockets, book bags and anything else that carried food home for them and their siblings to eat until returning to school on Monday. One instance that stands out is when a child was observed stuffing his pant pockets with spaghetti. Can you imagine what a mess that must have created, but food was available.

Advent has been cooperating with Interfaith since the inception of this program. Our roll has been to contribute money and provide delivery service every Thursday that school is open for the ten months of the school year. Their suggested donation is \$25.00 per month per back pack (now grocery bags) for the school year. Advent has steadfast been supporting this ministry and anticipates doing it for the foreseeable future. We are currently sponsoring Dunnellon Elementary School.

Today (2024) Interfaith caters to thirty-eight (38) schools equaling one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven (1987) students weekly.

# **FOOD for KIDS/ Backpack Program**

Drivers Needed: We are recruiting drivers for delivering backpacks to Dunnellon Elementary school. Our delivery date will probably be THURSDAY mornings, beginning on or about the first Thursday in September. We have not been given a definite start date as of this writing.

What's required to qualify for the driving position? You must have a vehicle that can carry 25 grocery bags of food, go downtown to the Interfaith facility, where they will load the bags for you, then you drive to Dunnellon Elementary School where they will unload your vehicle. Once unloaded you are free to continue your day's activities. How much time is required? Using the church as a starting point, I would guess 2 to 2 ½ hours. Total driving distance form Advent (round trip) would be estimated at 45 miles.

If you telephone the school when leaving Interfaith, they will try to have someone awaiting your arrival.
